Pop singer Kesha to perform at Stroh Center in B.G.

The show is in collaboration with Bands4Change, a company started by Maumee Valley Country Day School senior Maya Dayal in 2015 that hosts concerts to raise awareness for local and global social issues, as well as to raise money for charities addressing those issues.

While Kesha is set to take the stage in Bowling Green, 100 percent of the profits will be donated to charities such as Human Society International, National Eating Disorder Association and Rape Abuse and Incest National Network.
